Keep Moving!

The US Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and the Department of Health and Human Services recommend that adults aged 18 to 64 years have:

- At least 150 minutes a week of moderate intensity activity such as brisk walking
- At least 2 days a week of activities that strengthen muscles



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
